2. Services and Events

Family and Friends Sighted Guiding Training delivered in conjunction with the Guide Dogs Organisation

We have been working with the Guide Dogs Organisation to deliver their Friends and Family Sighted Guide Sessions at Hanley library.

Attendees have learnt tips and practical advice about how to guide in a safe and appropriate way, including through narrow spaces like doors and up and down steps.

Feedback has been excellent and the next session will be held on Wednesday 30th October from 10.30am til 12.30pm in the JRR Tolkien Room at Hanley library which is on the first floor.
